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Ed.G.E – Educating Children & Young People on Gender Equality

Ed.G.E is a European project that aims to contribute to the prevention and combating of GBV, by raising awareness to children and young people on gender equality through cultural-based activities and tools, including art-based online games/applications and the involvement of children museums and schools.

In this framework, four National and one Summary reports were conducted. The Summary report is a comparative analysis of Ed.G.E – Educating Children and Young People on Gender Equality project. It summarises and contrasts prevalent data gathered from four national reports (GR, CY, IT, UK) on the current state of Gender Equality (GE) in the four consortium countries, where 90 children, 107 parents and/or carers and 95 teachers were involved and have identified needs and gaps as well as good practices in terms of methodologies, activities, tools and techniques, in approaching GE at home and school.

Based on the four national reports:

- gaps and needs were reported by the target groups/ countries in terms of challenging social norms, gender stereotypes and roles;
- knowledge and awareness gaps, a conceptual gap, teaching and training gap and a gap in supporting cultures and policies were reported as prevalent;
- needs in fostering awareness and education from the early days and in a systematic way emerged; and
- a need for training and lifelong learning opportunities along with a call for appropriate and effective methodologies, practices and tools were highlighted.

Based on the aforementioned results, the Ed.G.E consortium is currently working on a new curriculum with learning activities and digital tools for students, parents, teachers and museum & art professionals.
